Coats for Kids is a free service provided by the **North Newmarket Lions** who collect and distribute winter coats, snowsuits, snow pants, boots, hats, mitts, scarves - from infant to adult sizes. The North Newmarket Lions and the Newmarket Lioness man a "store" in Newmarket to house this important project. The store space has been generously donated to the Clubs so costs are minimal.

The store opened in 2014 at the end of November and was open on Saturday mornings from 10 am to 1 pm until mid March. Almost 200

coats were given away along with boots, hats, scarves and mitts.

Donations from the community of clean, gently used winter coats was overwhelming and the store was soon overflowing. There are enough coats safely stored to make a really good start this winter. We open on Thanksgiving weekend and will close mid March.

The "store" is located at 1271 Gorham Street, Suite #8 - at the corner of Gorham and Harry Walker Parkway - convenient, as there is public transport on both roads.

Many families were helped last winter - kids who were so quickly growing out of snowsuits and Moms and Dads who didn't have proper winter coats. Families were grateful to find a place where no questions were asked - "just help yourself to whatever you and your family need".



SOME SUGGESTIONS TO THINK ABOUT

- ⇒ Remember everything you post online is public. It doesn't matter whether or not you delete the message or text. If you've published it, it's traceable. When you post things online, you're creating a cyber fingerprint. So make sure that every post represents the values and ethics of Lionism.
- ⇒ Respect your audience: This might be the most important rule of social media etiquette. Show respect to everyone who visits your page. These are simple social skills you should already be following in real life; now, you just have to follow them online too.
- ⇒ Share your club's events and activities with other clubs so that the greatness of what it means to be a Lion can be played forward
- ⇒ Create a final checklists to ensure that your message reflects the ideals of Lionism, check for any grammar issues, check that the information and dates are correct, check that you have permission to upload the photos that you are using especially with minors, and make sure if you are linking a site that the link is valid.





SOME SUGGESTIONS TO AVOID

- ⇒ Use all caps when you're emailing or posting something. All CAPS is a form of internet shouting.
- ⇒ Over use #hashtags. Hashtags are a good way to help get your tweets and Facebook posts categorized with similar content so when someone searches for that keyword, they find you. This does not mean that you turn every word in your posting into a hashtag because the message becomes too confusing.
- ⇒ Share the same message over and over again. People will start to jump over your posts

What are Signature Service Activities and Why Might I Use Them?

Most Club Secretaries, and others who complete the monthly LCI Service Activity Report, will be familiar with using MyLCI to add the activities and create the report. It can be a little quicker if you also use Signature Activities for the things your club does every year, or maybe even every month or week.

A Signature Activity is something done on a regular, repetitive basis, and it will be something your club is known for in your community. Examples: Be in the Santa Claus parade; Clean up a park or pond each spring/fall; Offer spaghetti dinners every Friday in the summer; BBQ lunch at the senior's home; many more. People will know that "The Lions do that." It's one of your club's signatures.

To add them (just once): Select Signature Activities from the My Lions Club list and then select Add Signature Service Activity and fill in the repetitive information about that activity. Save it.

To use them (many times): When adding activities, open the Signature Activity drop-down box and choose the one you want. Your activity will be populated with all the information you saved when you added it. Then just add the variable details such as # of Lions, hours, people served, etc.

Just **before you Save**, make sure "Share this story" is selected so that the good works of all your Lions can be seen and appreciated. It's great to always share.

For more help with the Service Activity Report, enter 'sar_faq' in the LCI web site search box (magnifying glass).

The first quarter of 2015-2016 is almost behind us. A wonderful summer, but now September has witnessed the release of energy from many Lions across our Region. Certainly the District Activity Reports for July/August indicated planning, organising and implementation of events, and the resumption of Regular Club meetings.

First, let's look at the baseline numbers. For August 2015, LCI recorded the following statistics. One Region, two Zones, 14 Lions Clubs, and 332 members. A good start, but surely there is room for growth. Region 18 is the most densely populated area in District A16, are we carrying our share of the load?

The District A16 planning sessions have been very helpful to our Clubs. For example, the District Directory for 2015-2016 was received on August 22. This Directory is an invaluable tool in assisting Region and Zone Chairs in their duties. The information content is remarkable, eg. does your Club Treasurer need an overview of the Lions Billing Structure? See page 52.

Many activities have come and gone, and it's difficult to keep track. However, our hardworking Secretaries are keeping us up to date. For example, the 16th Annual Oshawa/Clarington Community Picnic attracted upwards of 250 people. The Grandview Childrens Centre benefited by \$6,500.00 resulting from the Auto Fest 50/50 draw. Simply put, "we serve".

On the sports and youth side, the impact of charity golf tournaments sponsored by Lions Clubs is remarkable. One example, on July 11, Dave Dryden from Sleeping Children Around the World Foundation was on hand to play golf, and accept 300 plus bed kits for the foundation. This Canadian initiative is worldwide in scope, reminds me of Lions!

September 19/20, the 7th Annual Charity Table Tennis Tournament was held in Markham. This event draws huge crowds, 9 tables in play, Club banners, and Leo's everywhere. Also spotted was the "Tom Gordon Cup", yes, Lion Tom of the "Yes we Can" approach to lionism.

Joint Zone Meetings are coming up very soon; Zone Chairs are working hard on venues, menus and agendas, and are hopeful of a large turnout in 18 East and 18 West. We are looking forward to greeting you, the 332 Lions of Region 18.




